Quarterly Test of Salem/Hope Creek Nuclear Generating Stations Alert and Notification System

Dover, Del. – The Delaware Emergency Management Agency (DEMA), in collaboration with the Delaware State Police (DSP) and Public Service Enterprise Group Inc. (PSEG), will conduct a quarterly test of the Salem/Hope Creek Nuclear Generating Station's Alert and Notification system. The test is scheduled for Tuesday, July 2, at 7:20 p.m.

Key Details:

- **Location:** There are 37 sirens within a 10-mile radius of the Salem/Hope Creek Nuclear Generating Stations in New Jersey.
- **Coverage Area:** The sirens cover an area extending north from Delaware city, west to Middletown, and south to Woodland Beach.
- **Test Procedure:** During the test, the sirens will be activated for three to five minutes. Following this, a test message will be broadcast via the Emergency Alert System (EAS) on local radio stations.
- **Purpose:** This test is part of an ongoing program to monitor the integrity of the siren system.
- **Emergency Alert Signal:** In the event of an actual emergency, citizens will hear a series of steady three to five-minute siren sounds. This signal indicates that they should tune in to an Emergency Alert System (EAS) station for critical emergency information or instructions.
