ONE-PAGE DETAILED PROJECT DESCRIPTION (Question #24):

Historic Manor House Renovation for Kent County/UGRR Museum

The purpose of this project is to renovate the historic Goggin Manor House on the grounds of Brecknock County Park in Camden, DE in order to be used as a future Kent County Historical and Underground Railroad Museum. The park and house are owned and maintained by Kent County Levy Court and the house is currently in need of renovation to allow for general public access.

Brecknock Park is an 86-acre park with historic farm and millpond site adjacent to the Isaac Branch stream corridor and was acquired from the estate of Elizabeth Howell Goggin. The land that now includes Brecknock Park was first granted to Alexander Humphrey in 1680. Subsequent owners, such as John Clayton Jr. and Joshua Gregg and Thomas Hanson, operated a grain mill on the property, which the foundation still remains to this day. The Manor House was built during four major construction periods beginning in the 18th century through the late 19th century. This house is constructed of brick and frame and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

In 2002, a conditions assessment was conducted by JAED Facilities Solutions to determine the necessary renovation work to open the house to general public use in the form of a museum, park office, or recreational programming space. This conditions assessment was used in preparing the grant budget request.

Renovation of the main building systems (electrical, HVAC, and plumbing) would be required to meet current code and efficiency standards and best practices. Establishing structural integrity would require additional floor framing and shoring, window repairs, and investigation into uneven settling of part of the house. Additional work to the inside of the house would include repair or reapplying of plaster wall and ceiling surfaces, and reconstruction of the existing bathrooms and kitchen area. Furthermore, ADA requirement for access requires ramping for ingress and egress.

This project meets the requirements of the "Save America's Treasures" program through the National Park Service since the Goggin Manor is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Kent County, DE is comprised of over 177,000 residents, but just as important, Kent County also needs additional economic development drivers such as activities encompassed through tourism. An additional local museum, including a collection of Underground Railroad items, would be a solid foundation for additional out of state visitors, including those traveling on the Harriet Tubman Freedom Byway (https://harriettubmanbyway.org/).
